## HONORS/RANK IN CLASS

### GRADUATION HONORS

### A. WEIGHTED COURSES

Honors, foreign languages, pre-calculus, and calculus courses will receive a weighted evaluation for the grade point average to determine class rank. Weighted classes will be given one additional quality point if the course is passed (A - 5 points, B - 4 points, C - 3 points, and D - 2 points). Advanced Placement and dual enrollment courses will receive 2 additional quality points if the course is passed.

### B. CLASS RANK

Honor graduates will be chosen for class rank on a four, five or six (weighted classes) quality point scale from all courses taken in grades 9-12 and high school course credits earned in grades 7 and 8. **Beginning with the 2018-2019**, **rank will be calculated after the seventh semester.** Honor graduates will be announced at honor night. The Talented 20 designations will be given to those students whose cumulative GPA ranks in the top twenty percent of qualified students.

### c. VALEDICTORIAN AND SALUTATORIAN

A Valedictorian and salutatorian will be identified by the highest and second highest weighted grade point average. To qualify for either of these two honors, a student must be enrolled at Hamilton County High School in the senior class for the entire year beginning the first day of school.

## HONORS/RANK IN CLASS

### D. SUMMA AND MAGNA CUM LAUDE

For a student to be considered for the summa cum laude and magna cum laude honors, he/she must take the academic courses to be considered for the Florida Scholars' awards. These include the following:

- 1. Four (4) English/Language Arts
- 2. Four (4) Mathematics (Algebra I and above)
- 3. Three (3) Natural Science (2 with substantial lab)
- 4. Three (3) Social Science
- 5. Two (2) World Languages (in same language)

Students must also earn the minimum score on each subsection of the PERT, ACT, or SAT. Minimum scores are:

PERT College Readiness Scores

Writing - 103

Reading - 106

Math-114 (Intermediate Algebra); 123 (College Algebra); 150 (Calculus 1)

**ACT College Readiness Scores** 

Writing/English - 17

Reading - 19

Math - 19 (Intermediate Algebra); 21 (College Algebra); 30 (Calculus 1)

SAT College Readiness Scores

Writing/English - 25

Reading – 24

Math – 24 (Intermediate Algebra); 26.5 (College Algebra); 31 (Calculus 1)

## HONORS/RANK IN CLASS

Students who do not meet the requirements to be considered for summa cum laude or magna cum laude honors will be recognized as cum laude graduates.

The following scale will be used to designate honor graduates:

Summa Cum Laude 4.0 GPA and above Magna Cum Laude 3.75 - 3.999 GPA Cum Laude 3.50 - 3.749 GPA

## Florida Bright Futures Scholarship Program Florida Academic Scholars (FAS) / Florida Medallion Scholars (FMS) 2022-23

#### Initial Eligibility Requirements: (As determined by the Florida Department of Education)

- 1. Submit the Florida Financial Aid Application (FFAA) no later than August 31 after high school graduation.
- 2. Graduated from a Florida high school with a standard high school diploma or its equivalent.
- 3. Complete the 16 college-preparatory courses required for admission to a state university.
- 4. Achieve the required weighted GPA in the 16 college-preparatory courses per the chart below.
- 5. Achieve the required composite ACT° or combined SAT° score no later than June 30 of the student's graduation year (or through January 31 for mid-year graduates), per the chart below.
- 6. Complete the required number of volunteer service or paid work hours per the chart below.

# Florida Bright Futures Scholarship Program Florida Gold Seal CAPE Scholars (GSC) 2022-23

### Initial Eligibility Requirements: (As determined by the Florida Department of Education.)

- 1. Submit the Florida Financial Aid Application (FFAA) no later than August 31 after high school graduation.
- 2. Graduate with a standard high school diploma or its equivalent.
- Earn a minimum of 5 postsecondary credit hours through CAPE industry certifications that articulate for college credit.
- 4. Complete at least 30 volunteer service or 100 paid work hours.

### Requirements to Receive an Award: (As determined by your postsecondary institution.)

- 1. Be evaluated by the Office of Student Financial Assistance (OSFA) as meeting initial eligibility requirements.
- 2. Be a Florida resident and U.S. citizen or eligible noncitizen.
- 3. Enroll as a degree- or certificate-seeking student at a Florida institution in at least 6 non-remedial semester credit hours.

#### Scholarship Restrictions:

Until a student has earned an eligible associate degree, Gold Seal CAPE (GSC) scholarships may only be used at postsecondary institutions that offer an applied technology diploma, technical degree education program (associate in applied science or associate in science), or a career certificate program.

Upon completion of an eligible associate degree program, a GSC Scholar may also receive an award for a maximum of 60 credit hours toward an eligible baccalaureate degree.

# Florida Bright Futures Scholarship Program Florida Gold Seal Vocational Scholars (GSV) 2022-23

### Initial Eligibility Requirements: (As determined by the Florida Department of Education.)

- 1. Submit the Florida Financial Aid Application (FFAA) no later than August 31 after high school graduation.
- Graduate with a standard Florida high school diploma or its equivalent.
- 3. Achieve the required weighted 3.0 GPA in the non-elective high school courses.
- 4. Complete at least 3 full credits in a single Career and Technical Education program.
- 5. Achieve the required minimum 3.5 unweighted GPA in the single Career and Technical Education program.
- 6. Complete 30 volunteer service hours or 100 paid work hours.
- Achieve the required minimum scores on one of the college entrance exams per the chart below no later than June 30 of the year the student graduates from high school.
